ANGLO-SAXONS

A 'hands-on' experience for children in the classroom

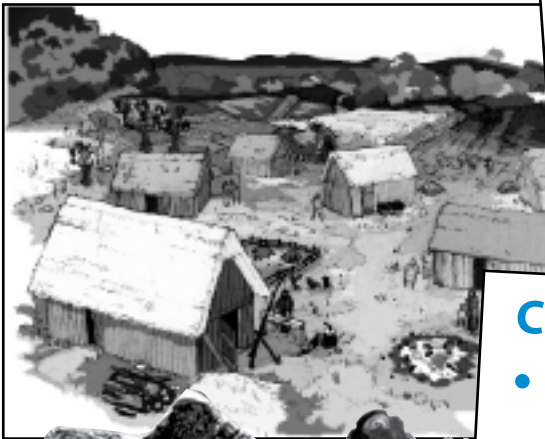
Led by an experienced museum educator and supported by a wide selection of replica Anglo-Saxon artefacts.

Suitable for KS2. Supports the QCA History Unit 6B: *Why have people invaded and settled in Britain in the past? An Anglo-Saxon case study.*

Children will:

- Learn about the work of archaeologists and how they find out about the past.
- Place the Anglo-Saxon period in a chronological framework, discuss the relationship between invasion and settlement and discover why the Angles chose to invade Britain.
- Reconstruct a typical Anglo-Saxon grave.
- Find out how Anglo-Saxons were buried and what burials tell us about their beliefs, way of life, crafts and technology.
- Watch a short powerpoint presentation of the Sutton Hoo site and the artefacts found there.
- Compare their typical Anglo-Saxon grave to the Royal burial at Sutton Hoo.

- Reconstruct a half size model in rope of the Sutton Hoo boat and place within it pictorial evidence of the grave goods discovered there.
- Discover how the site was found, the position and quality of the grave goods and what this tells us about the person buried.
- Use observational and deductive skills to establish how artefacts were made and used, what they represent and what we use today instead.
- Dress up in replica Anglo-Saxon clothing.



Cost £100 for a two hour session, morning or afternoon, or £180 for two sessions in one day. Maximum of 35 children per session.
