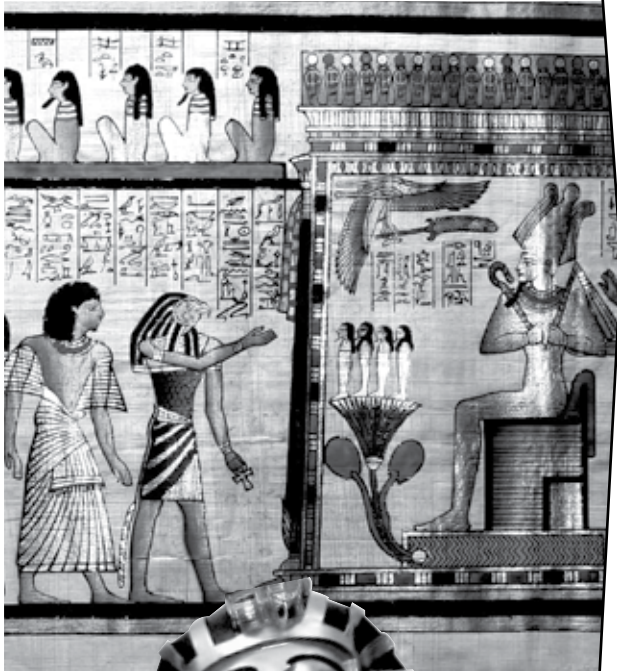

# Ancient Egypt



## A 'hands-on' experience for children in the classroom

 Suitable for KS1 *The lives of famous people, Tutankhamen*

## Children will:

- Look inside an archaeologist's treasure chest and discover what objects have survived from the time of the ancient Egyptians and what they can tell us about the life and beliefs of this ancient civilization.
- Handle pieces of original Egyptian pottery and jewellery.
- Discover what the ancient Egyptians believed about life after death. Learn about the process of mummification and handle original mummy cloth, an Ashabdi figure and a scarab beetle.
- Understand the significance and power of the Pharaohs and gods through a replica funerary mask of Tutankhamen.
- Learn about religion and superstition.
- Write their names in hieroglyphs.
- Smell and touch the foods and spices grown along the banks of the Nile.
- Dress up in replica Egyptian costume.

Cost £100 for a two hour session, morning or afternoon, or £180 for two sessions in one day. Maximum of 35 children per session.
