Suitable for KS2. Supports the QCA History Unit 14 "Who were the ancient Greeks?"



Children will:

- Discover what objects have survived from the time of the ancient Greeks and what they can tell us about the life and beliefs of this ancient civilization.
- Understand what life was like for a Greek hoplite by trying on replica armour and handling original projectile heads.
- See how ancient Greek pottery can provide direct evidence of the Greek way of life.
- Explore the differences between Athenian and Spartan society through structured role-play.
- Draw on a variety of sources, including original and replica objects, to reconstruct a Greek symposium.
- Find out how the Greeks used a rhyton and a kylix (drinking cups).
- Learn how the Greeks cared for their appearance and handle pieces of original jewellery.
- Dress up in replica Greek costume.

Cost £100 for a two hour session, morning or afternoon, or £180 for two sessions in one day.
Maximum of 35 children per session.
Ancient Greece can be combined with *Ancient Olympics* to provide activities for the whole day.
