1.0 What this help sheet covers

2.0 Subscribing to the website

When you subscribe please choose a role. The role is really important in defining your use of the website as it defines what depth of detail you will see in the content on the website. It will be possible to get to other content that is not designed for you but it will not be the first information that you will see. It is possible to change your role later but please try to choose the right role for your needs: -

Child

When you subscribe as a child you will see content that is specifically written for younger people. Although the content will have less depth than some of the other roles you will see content that is relevant to the kinds of things you might need for your studies or your interests. It will include information about how to visit places of interest.

Adult

As an adult you will see content that is in a little more depth than a child. It will be written with a general interest audience in mind. It will include information about how to visit places of interest.

Teacher

As a Teacher you are interested in providing material to your students and organising material for your lessons. You will be looking for content that is designed and written to help you run classes. It will include information about how schools can visit places of interest. It will also include content written for you by our Education Officer.

Specialist

As a specialist you are primarily concerned with academic study, you will be interested in seeing in-depth detail and will be used to complex and detailed content that will be written by academics.

1. There are three ways to subscribe

- Your username must be unique and it must not contain any punctuation of any kind. The system will dynamically read your user name to ensure that it is valid. If the user name is invalid it will turn red and there will be a cross next to the field. If you create an invalid user name please select a new one.
- Select your role that best suits you

3. Single left click on Submit and the system will confirm your membership.

4. The website will send you an email providing a password.
